Course Description:

This course provides the information needed to recognize infants and children at risk for cardiopulmonary arrest, as well as the information and strategies needed to prevent cardiopulmonary arrest in this population. It also provides the cognitive and psychomotor skills needed to resuscitate and stabilize infants and children who are in respiratory failure, shock, or cardiopulmonary arrest. This 8-hour program was developed to assist PALS providers in remaining current in PALS. Individuals who possess a current PALS card are eligible to renew through this 1-day program. This course meets all requirements as set forth by the American Heart Association (AHA).

Objectives:

At the end of the course the participants will be able to demonstrate the following skills:

1. Provide pediatric basic life support
2. Know how to reduce the risk of common causes of injury and arrest in this population
3. Recognize the signs of impending respiratory failure and shock.
4. Initiate treatment of impending and overt respiratory failure and shock
5. Stabilize and evaluate pediatric trauma victims, including appropriate spinal immobilization
6. Identify and treat unstable cardiac rhythms
7. Initiate the first 10 minutes of resuscitation of a pediatric cardiac arrest
8. Provide support for families and providers during a child's serious illness, injury, or death
