

## **IV Approval Clinical Objectives**

1. Allow the student the opportunity to observe and participate in the care and assessment of patients in the hospital and pre-hospital settings.
2. Allow interaction between the student and hospital and pre-hospital personnel.
3. Allow the student, under direct supervision of experienced hospital or pre-hospital personnel, to initiate IV therapy skills that have been taught during the Course.
4. The following information on the IV Clinical Log must be completed in order to receive a course completion certificate:
  - a. Student Name
  - b. Course Dates
  - c. Clinical Site
  - d. Clinical Date
  - e. Preceptor Name
  - f. Preceptor Signature

### **Competencies**

Upon completion of the IV Approval program, the student will be able to:

1. Set up IV equipment using aseptic technique
2. Perform venipuncture using aseptic technique
3. Obtain a blood sample using aseptic technique
4. Insert an IV catheter using aseptic technique
5. Perform glucose level testing
6. Administer 50% Dextrose
7. Nebulized Albuterol Administration

**Each student is responsible for the rotation evaluation form and IV Approval Log. Student experiences must be verified by a preceptor signature and submitted within 60 days of successful completion of final exam.**
